Parents Evenings

The children will receive their first school report of the year at our parent's evenings later this term. These meetings will take place on Wednesday 20th & Thursday 21st March for parents who require interpreters and in the week beginning April 1st for everyone else. Parents will be given their child's first report of the year and will have the opportunity to discuss it during the meeting, so it is important that you attend. You will be able to sign up for an appointment the week before the meetings, unless you have been booked with an interpreter in which case you will receive a letter giving you a date and time.

School Uniform

A reminder that at Southbury we expect all the children to wear school uniform. This includes footwear and children must wear sensible black shoes and it is only permissible to wear trainers if they are smart plain black trainers, **not** coloured or patterned footwear. In addition either grey or black school trousers/skirts should be worn, jogging bottoms are not part of our uniform except in the Nursery. We will be conducting a school uniform check next week and expect to see the children appropriately dressed.
