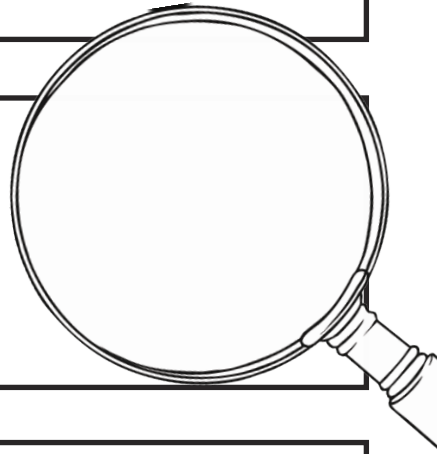
## Puzzle One

# Answers



## 1. Pat the beast on its head.

## 2. What do you think that **Puzzle One** is instructing you to do?

**Accept any sensible answer, such as: I think that puzzle one is instructing you to brush your teeth.**



## 3. What should you do after moving the stick around your mouth?

**After moving the stick around your mouth, you should spit neatly into the bowl.**



## 4. Imagine that you are the author.

Write an instruction puzzle for catching a ball.

**Pupils' own responses, such as: Put your hands together. Move them towards the round, flying object. Grab the object. Cheer loudly.**
