**Pupils' own responses, such as: The word 'majestic' gives the reader the impression that the mountains are something great and impressive.**

**Pupils' own responses, such as: The simile 'covering them like a blanket' adds meaning as it helps the reader to imagine what the water looks and moves like as it covers the stones.**



4. Why do you think the author has described the lake as a **secluded gem**?

**Accept any reasonable inference, such as: I think the author has described the lake as a 'secluded gem' to emphasise that it's a hidden, beautiful place.**
